

MICHELMERSH & TIMSBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Minutes of the Annual Parish Council Meeting held on Wednesday 26th May 2010 at 7.30 p.m. at the Jubilee Hall, Timsbury.

1. Apologies

2. Election of Chairman and Vice-Chairman and to receive declarations of acceptance of office from both.

Cllr. R. Fitzgerald proposed Cllr. R. Davis as Chairman and Cllr. J. Rhodes as Vice Chairman. This proposal was seconded by Cllr. A. Jones. Cllr. Davis and Cllr. Rhodes accepted and duly signed copies of their declarations of acceptance.

Cllr. Rhodes expressed his thanks to the Chairman for his efforts at the Annual Parish Meeting held on 17th May. The Clerk also passed on the thanks and congratulations on a successful meeting to the Chairman from Mr. Peter Pritchard-Brown.

Open Period re-opened

Dr. Subramanyam requested an update on the situation regarding the posts on Bridleway 5 installed by Banner Homes. The Chairman stated that Hampshire County Council had not made any further comment, but that he would request a response from them. It was noted that the location and the square shape of the posts may pose a potential hazard to horse riders on the bridleway.

7. Planning

7.1 Applications

Proposal: First floor extension over existing flat roof area to garage to accommodate a new bedroom and bathroom.

It was agreed that after the internal audit has been completed, Cllr. R. Fitzgerald and the Clerk would review the book -keeping system currently in place.

9. Recreation Ground.

9.1 Proposal to amend the current licence arrangements with the Sports Club for the use of the recreation ground. Update.

The draft lease presented to the Sports Club for comment specified that the pavilion and store would be insured by the Parish Council, the cost to be reimbursed by the Club. This was apparently not acceptable to the Club. The alternative was that the Club would be responsible for insuring the buildings. The view was that this would be acceptable, subject to confirmation from the Council's solicitors, but that the Parish Council must approve the valuation on which the premium was based because of the risks involved in under-insurance, although over-valuation was also to be avoided because this would result in an excessive premium. *It was agreed* that to progress matters the Parish Council would seek advice from AON (the current insurer) on the procedure for valuing the pavilion and store for insurance purposes and, if possible, obtain valuations from other insurers and corresponding competitive quotes for insuring the buildings.

It was also agreed that the grass cutting quote supplied by Test Valley Borough Council for the recreation ground was reasonable and would set a benchmark for future tenders.

9.2 Pavilion Showers – progress update.

It was agreed the Chairman obtain a second opinion for resolving the showers' plumbing issue.

9.3 Repairs to Recreation Ground Fencing

It was agreed that an additional quote from 'Whitedog' be obtained before proceeding with the fence repairs. The fence repairs were authorised by the Parish Council. The Chairman informed the Council that a grant may be available for the additional fencing to the Pocket Park as the area is a SINC.

It was agreed that the clerk requests the Lengthman to conduct a survey of the main routes in the village to identify specific areas which would benefit from his efforts. A list of tasks would then be compiled based on his recommendations.
