A time to remember.....

Sunday the 11th of November is Armistice Day and 100 years since the end of hostilities in the First World War. There are a number of events planned throughout the country to mark this centenary. Here is a short list of local events - others will be advertised in the local press and circulated on social media.

Romsey School - Friday 2 November

7.00pm – a talk by Dr. Emily Mayhew from Imperial College: 'Wounded – The Long Journey Home from The Great War'.

In the village at

St Mary's Church - Sunday 11 November

10am - An informal gathering, with refreshments. A chance to remember friends and family at the war memorial, with readings of First World War poems. A traditional silence will be held at 11am.

St Andrew's Church

10:45am - Family Service and Remembrance

St Mary's Church

6 pm - Remembrance Service with the Michelmersh Silver Band, followed by the national ringing of bells to commemorate 100 years since the Armistice.

Romsey Abbey - Sunday 11 November

9.30am - A Civic Service for Remembrance Sunday (an earlier start than usual) after which there will be a procession to Romsey War Memorial Park for 11 am Act of Remembrance.

Stockbridge Down - Sunday 11 November

A beacon (one of a national chain) will be lit at 7pm. Details on <https://www.nationaltrust.org.uk/events> (find 'Armistice Day Beacon lightings')

Romsey Abbey - Wednesday 14th November

7:30pm - A concert to remember the end of the Great War.

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

PLANNING

Full details of all planning applications and the Parish Council's responses to them are recorded in the Parish Council [minutes](#) (Minutes of Council Meetings can be found on the village website) and on the [Test Valley Borough](#) or [Hampshire County Council websites](#).

Planning Applications Reviewed at Parish Council Meeting on 31st October (Comments summarise the key points only)

18/02707/FULLS: Little Meadow, Rudd Lane - Erection of four residential units and associated detached garages

Decision: Objection: the proposed houses are too close to the boundaries to provide sufficient space for effective screening from houses on Rudd Lane and from other points in the surrounding countryside. The rear three houses are too large and too closely spaced on this narrow plot: fewer houses of this size, or smaller houses (perhaps a terrace or semi-detached) would be more appropriate for this site. The proposed front elevation of Plot 1, which would face Rudd Lane, is unattractive and differs from the other houses on the lane which are of more traditional style.

18/02578/FULLS: Land south of Smallberry Hill, Haccups Lane - Erection of 4 residential dwellings with associated landscaping and parking

Decision: Objection: the development and access road would have an adverse visual impact on the approach to the Conservation Area, potential traffic issues on Haccups Lane and safety of new access, proposed layout and house design out-of-character with the area where existing houses are generally of distinctive appearance with individual access and large plots. The Parish Council will raise questions about whether an access road should be permitted to cross land designated as countryside, and about the proposals for the continued upkeep of the section of the site not included in the building plots.

18/02652/TREES: : Michelmersh Court, Church Road - Tree works:

T1 Pine Scott – fell, T2 Oak – crown reduce, T3 Beech – crown reduce.

Decision: No objection
